HOLLYMOUNT PTA 100 CLUB

Welcome to the Hollymount PTA's 100 Club. This letter is to invite you to participate in the 100 club for 2011/12 and to explain how it all works.

The primary aim of our 100 Club is to raise funds for the school but there is the added bonus that you could win a cash prize at better odds than the National Lottery!

Many of you are probably familiar with the rules of a 100 club but for those of you who are new to this or need a reminder here's how it works:

You complete the slip at the bottom of this letter, stating how many numbers you would like.

Each number costs £10 for the year, with 50% of the proceeds going to the school and 50% of the proceeds going towards prize money.

Each number, 1 to 100 (higher if there are more than 100 participants), will be allocated randomly. You will be informed of your number(s) before the first draw.

The first draw will be at the end of November and then in each month up to and including July 2011 with the Xmas draw in December being for double the normal prize money – so 10 draws in total.

Three numbers will be drawn at random at each draw, which will be conducted under the auspices of an independent adjudicator. The 1st number drawn will win 1st prize (50% of the monthly prize money), the 2nd number drawn will win 2nd prize (30% of the monthly prize money) and the 3rd number drawn will win 3rd prize (20% of the monthly prize money).

For example 100 participants would generate £1,000 with £500 going towards the school and £500 going towards prize money. Each monthly draw would therefore have £50 prize money with 1st prize winning £25, 2nd prize £15 and 3rd prize £10 (double these amounts for the December draw).

Names of the monthly winners will be published in the school weekly newsletter with prizes available from the school office in the week following the draw.
